SUBJECT	DAC Agenda Item 5: Overview of Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) Program Re-evaluations

Background:

The Dental Board of California (Board) has the authority to audit (re-evaluate) programs and courses to ensure compliance with regulations in the event the Board deems it necessary.

Board staff began the re-evaluation process with the Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) programs. The order of the programs to be evaluated was determined by the Law and Ethics and the RDA Written Examination statistics, using the school or program's overall pass/fail rate and the year the program was given full approval.

Overview of Re-evaluation Process

The re-evaluation process is a re-review of currently approved courses and programs. The goal of the re-evaluation is to ensure that the programs and courses are currently in compliance with the current laws and regulations. During the re-evaluations, the approved programs and courses can continue to run their programs as usual. Once the program receives notification that they are being re-evaluated, they are given six weeks to submit the required documentation. Once the documentation has been received by the Board, the information is reviewed by a Board Subject Matter Expert (SME). Once the review is completed, the program is notified of their re-approval or of any deficiencies. If deficiencies have been identified, programs will receive notification in writing, and be given an opportunity to correct the issues identified.

In early 2019, it was brought to the attention of Board staff that programs were struggling with the re-evaluation process. Programs were concerned with the amount of time that they were given to respond to the re-evaluation request, and they seemed to have questions regarding what was required of them. Board staff made the decision to suspend new requests for re-evaluations. This decision was made to provide the current programs undergoing a re-evaluation and Board staff an opportunity to address any areas of concern.

Based on feedback from stakeholders, Board staff hosted informational workshops to go over the re-evaluation process. An email invitation was sent to all the Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) program directors and staff that would be assisting in the process. Two informational workshops were given; one on May 3, 2019 in Sacramento and the other on May 10, 2019 in Glendora, California.

Board staff, with the assistance of one of the Board's SMEs, provided a brief overview of the re-evaluation process and the basis for the re-evaluations. Board staff reviewed the expectations of the programs and went over the most common deficiencies found while conducting the re-evaluations. Attendees were given the opportunity to ask questions regarding the process and were given the contact information of Board staff and management, should the program directors have any specific questions relating to extensions, the re-evaluation process, or deficiency notices. Board staff and program directors agreed that the open dialogue was helpful, and the program directors were more at ease with the process. Many program directors felt the re-evaluation process was daunting as they were new to their positions, but they were optimistic to take on this challenge.

Subsequently, Board staff received additional feedback from stakeholders indicating that they felt the re-evaluation process needed improvement. Specifically, that the applications were duplicative, there were deficiencies sent out to programs that were for items not listed on the applications, and that the information requested on the applications is confusing (i.e., the number of requested application copies, missing instructions on submission of documents, inconsistency in language of items).

To rectify the issues mentioned, Board staff is in the process of developing a new application specifically for the re-evaluation process. When complete, the final product will merge all current RDA program requirements into one application, which will remove the issue of duplication and should clarify and make it easier to identify all the required documents. Additionally, Board staff is developing a checklist, as requested, to make the application requirements clear.

Board staff was also informed that there was concern regarding privacy and confidentiality. Programs were concerned that the applications requested the personal information of the program director and faculty, and they wondered what happened to the documents they submitted after the re-evaluation has been approved. During the workshops, Board staff explained that all SMEs have signed privacy and confidentiality agreements and that all documents are kept by the Board or shredded by Board staff. Board staff also advised attendees that they can omit their addresses from the Curriculum vitae's that they submit with their application.

Additionally, Board staff were informed that there was concern regarding what appeared to be inconsistencies of policies regarding timeframes, extensions, and that the Board has unrealistic due dates. Throughout the re-evaluation process, Board staff and management have expressed numerous times that we are willing to work with programs regarding due dates or extensions. Board staff are willing to work with each program and give as much time and assistance as we are able. We have granted several requests for extensions, on a case-by-case basis and based on each program's operational needs, these extensions can vary. Board staff are determining if initial lead time is warranted and will be deciding on that

amount of time, prior to sending out new requests for re-evaluation. All programs have been encouraged to communicate with Board staff and or management if they need any assistance during this process, if they have concerns, and to ask for additional time.

Board staff have also created a schedule to identify when programs are undergoing their Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) re-evaluations to avoid the programs being evaluated by both entities during the same year.

The re-evaluation process is a work in progress. We believe that the new application, once approved, will assist in making this a smoother process for all involved and we welcome any further suggestions.

At the December 4, 2020 Board meeting, information was provided regarding the status of RDA program re-evaluations. Due to the influx of new dental assisting program and course applications, which take priority over re-evaluations, there have been no updates to the RDA Program Re-evaluations since December.

The California Dental Association (CDA) has launched a new recruitment campaign, Smile Crew of California, designed to highlight careers in dental assisting and create a pool of qualified candidates to help fill dental assistant job openings. The campaign is targeted at candidates displaced from service roles with transferable skills. Information regarding this campaign is attached.

In his role, he oversees the organization’s strategic market research, business intelligence, and market intelligence, as well as the operation of CDA’s Practice Support Center and Endorsed Programs.

Smile Crew California – Dental Assistant Pathway

Background

Along with thousands of other California employers, dental practices were blindsided by the COVID-19 pandemic. While initially closed or open only to emergency patients in April and May, dental practices that returned to full-time patient care beginning in June experienced challenges in restaffing, particularly for dental assistant (DA) and registered dental assistant (RDA) positions. After losing more than 50% of all dental office jobs from March to April, the dental sector initially surged in May and June, commensurate with offices reopening. However, that rebound slowed, and dental offices are operating at about 85% of staffing capacity according to data from the California Employment Development Department (EDD). Even prior to the pandemic, many regions in California were suffering from a shortage of DAs, with projections indicating the **need for more than 9,000 new DAs by 2028**, driven by demand for dental care among the state's aging population and ongoing research linking oral health and general health.

Program Design

Smile Crew CA aims to fill the gap in DAs and RDAs with an earn-as-you-learn model that prepares individuals to become Dental Assistants within a year, earning up to \$25/hr upon completing training. Smile Crew CA will offer a pathway for individuals, including those without a college degree, into an attractive career with a stable and safe working environment, usually with standard business hours. Moreover, a DA career offers a pathway to more advanced roles such as RDA, RDA in Extended Functions (RDAEF), or a role as dental office manager.

The training program includes three phases which will span 11-24 months, beginning with an introduction to dental assisting, on-the-job training for the core DA role, employment and training leading to RDA licensure. The introduction to dental assisting training will span four weeks and include 16 days of classroom time and 4 days of in-clinic time.

Timeline

The program is scheduled for launch next month and will be piloted in two regions with high demand for DAs (San Diego and the Bay Area). In this first pilot phase, the program will seek to train an initial cohort of 30 people per region. The program will aim to scale to reach 150 or more individuals in additional high-demand regions during the pilot's second phase (Los Angeles, Orange County, Inland Empire, and/or Sacramento), most likely in the fall of 2021.

SUBJECT	DAC Agenda Item 9: Discussion and Possible Action on Potential Amendments to Business and Professions Code 1750, Infection Control Course Requirements for Unlicensed Dental Assistants

Background:

During the Dental Board meeting on July 24, 2020, Claudia Pohl, RDA, provided comments during Public Comment to the Dental Board of California (Board) on behalf of the California Dental Assistants Association (CDAA), California Association of Dental Assisting Teachers (CADAT), and the Dental Assisting Educator’s Group (DAEG) of California, regarding the reevaluation of the standards currently found in Business and Professions Code (BPC) 1750 as it relates to the infection control education requirements for unlicensed dental assistants.

According to Ms. Pohl, BPC 1750 allows unlicensed dental assistants; which could potentially be someone with no background or knowledge in dentistry and/or infection control, to work in a dental office and participate in patient treatment and all facets of infection control without any infection control education or training for up to one year before needing to meet the requirement for infection control education.

Additionally, they expressed concern due to the COVID-19 pandemic. She commented that dental assistants play an essential role in infection control and prevention and need to have a solid base of knowledge prior to exposure, or potential exposure, to blood or other potentially infectious materials (OPIM).

Ms. Pohl has indicated that on May 7, 2020, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Occupational Safety and Health Administration’s (OSHA) issued guidance for Resuming Deferred and Preventive Dental Care, in which they stated, “dental health care personnel (DHCP) are in the very high-risk category for exposure to SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19 when they are performing certain aerosol generating procedures. This risk requires a level of heightened awareness, training, preparation, and adherence to a combination of standard and transmission-based precautions as appropriate to ensure the safe provision of care.” It is their belief that the current law does not reflect this need and that now more than ever, the education for infection control needs to be required before any risk

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of exposure to patients, dental healthcare workers and to prevent any cross contamination. They believe that requiring the 8-hour infection control course prior to exposure to blood or OPIM will provide the level and quality of care that our patients expect and deserve and protect the entire dental health team.

Lastly, Ms. Pohl mentioned, there is currently a Call to Action issued by the American Dental Assistants Association for a national minimum standard of education in infection control for the oral healthcare team.

Currently, BPC 1750 (c) specifies the employer of a dental assistant is responsible for ensuring that the dental assistant who has been in continuous employment for 120 days or more, has already successfully completed, or successfully completes, a two-hour course in the Dental Practice Act, an eight-hour course in infection control, and a course in basic life support.

Board staff are bringing this item to the Dental Assisting Council (Council) for discussion on whether they want to consider changing the existing statute to require the eight-hour infection control course prior to exposure to blood or OPIM.

Should the Council choose to consider changing the requirements as outlined in BPC 1750, to require the 8-hour infection control course prior to exposure to blood or OPIM for unlicensed dental assistants, it would require a legislative change and submission of a legislative proposal approved by the Board.

Action Requested:

Discuss and consider making a recommendation to the Board on whether the standards currently found in BPC 1750, as it relates to the infection control education requirements should be changed and if additional actions are warranted.

SUBJECT	Analysis of Passing Rates for the RDA Combined Examination in Comparison to Previous Examinations and by Examination Qualification Method

To obtain licensure as a registered dental assistant, candidates must pass the Registered Dental Assistant Combined Examination (RDA Combined). Previously, they were required to pass a combination of the Registered Dental Assistant Written Examination (RDA Written) and the Registered Dental Assistant Law and Ethics Examination (RDA Law and Ethics).

The Dental Board of California (Board) requested that the Office of Professional Examination Services (OPES) perform three analyses in relation to the passing rates for the RDA Combined:

1. Comparison of the rates at which candidates satisfied the requirements for licensure by passing in 2019–20 and in 2017–18. In 2019–20, passing was defined as passing the RDA Combined. In 2017–18, passing was defined as passing the RDA Written and the RDA Law and Ethics examinations.
2. Analysis of the passing rates for the RDA Combined and the combination of the RDA Written and Law and Ethics by candidate qualification method, i.e., formal education or on-the-job training. OPES also analyzed passing rates for the RDA Written (separately) and for the RDA Law and Ethics (separately) by candidate qualification method.
3. Comparison of passing rates for candidates who passed the RDA Combined after one or more attempts, with the passing rates for candidates who passed both the RDA Written and the RDA Law and Ethics after one or more attempts. These candidates did not necessarily achieve licensure. These rates were also broken down by qualification method.

Comparison of Rates of Achieving Licensure by Passing the RDA Combined 2019–20 and by Passing both the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics 2017–18

OPES analyzed how many candidates successfully completed licensure requirements by passing the RDA Combined in 2019–20 and by passing both the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics in 2017–18. OPES found that the passing rates for the RDA Combined are roughly comparable to the passing rates for the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics combination.

The rate at which candidates achieved licensure by passing the RDA Combined is statistically significantly greater than the rate at which candidates achieved licensure by passing both the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics. The difference is approximately 1.9%.

Analysis of the Rates of Satisfying the Requirements of Licensure by Candidate Qualification Method

For all examination configurations, OPES analyzed rates of achieving licensure by candidate qualification method. OPES found a small, significant difference in passing rates that favors candidates qualifying through formal education over candidates qualifying through on-the-job training.

After the adoption of the RDA Combined, there was a statistically significant increase in the passing rates for formal education candidates of approximately 2.5%. There was a smaller increase in the passing rates for on-the-job training candidates. However, the passing rates for both types of candidates are still within approximately 3% of each other.

Table 1 shows the rates at which on-the-job candidates, education candidates, and all candidates achieved licensure by passing the combination of the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics in 2017–18 or the RDA Combined in 2019–20. The transition to the RDA Combined resulted in increased passing rates for all candidates, due largely to the 2.5% increase in passing rates for education candidates mentioned above.

Table 2 below shows examination-level statistics by candidate qualification method, i.e., the rates at which on-the-job candidates, education candidates, and all candidates passed the separate examinations. The statistical analyses showed the following:

2019–2020

- Education candidates passed the RDA Combined at a statistically significantly greater rate than on-the-job candidates. The difference was 3.6%.

2017–2018

- Education candidates passed the RDA Written at a statistically significantly greater rate than on-the-job candidates. The difference was 3.4%.
- Education candidates passed the RDA Law and Ethics at a statistically significantly greater rate than on-the-job candidates. The difference was 5.9%.

In all cases, education candidates passed the examinations at a slightly greater rate than on-the-job candidates.

OPES previously analyzed the passing rates for the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics in 2016. At that time, OPES also found that candidates who qualified to take the examinations through formal education passed the examinations at a higher rate than those who qualified through on-the-job training.

Analysis of Passing Rates by Candidate Qualification Method, for Candidates Passing After One or More Attempts

OPES also compared the passing rates for the RDA Combined 2019–20 with the passing rates for the RDA Written and RDA Law and Ethics 2017–18. This comparison shows how the change in examination configuration to the RDA Combined affected passing scores by qualification method. Table 3 shows that the change in configuration was associated with an increase in the passing percentage for the Education group but not for the On-the-Job group.

SUBJECT	DAC Agenda Item 12: Update Regarding RDAEF Examination

Background:

The Dental Board of California (Board) administers the Registered Dental Assistant in Extended Functions (RDAEF) clinical and practical examinations as outlined in Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 1753.4.

The examination has previously offered approximately eight (8) times per year at California dental schools. Approximately 25 to 30 candidates are tested at each examination administration. There are currently eleven (11) Board-approved RDAEF programs. The RDAEF examination consists of a clinical and practical examination, therefore, it must be held at a dental school which also must have enough space to accommodate the increasing number of applicants. Currently, there are six (6) dental schools in California.

The procedures tested in the clinical and practical examinations are specified in statute, at BPC section 1753.4. The clinical examination consists of two (2) evaluated procedures (cord retraction and final impression) requiring the candidate to secure a sponsoring Dentist (DDS), who is most often their employer, and a patient. The practical examination consists of two (2) evaluated procedures (amalgam and composite restorations) performed on a typodont (mannikin). These examinations are administered in dental clinics and dental laboratories at the designated California dental schools.

The RDAEF clinical and practical examinations had previously been offered at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) School of Dentistry, and the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Dentistry and are administered by Board staff. These schools have been used for the clinical and practical examinations administration due to their size and ability to accommodate the number of candidates. The Board attempts to reserve the sites and alternate Northern and Southern California examinations dates; however, the dental schools are also used by other testing agencies, continuing education course providers and the dental school's own dental students.

In May, staff received notification that UCLA and UCSF would not be able to host the Board's RDAEF clinical and practical examinations due to the Governor's stay at home order and concerns surrounding COVID-19. In response, the Board cancelled the two practical and clinical examinations that were scheduled for June 2020. In July, Board staff again received

notification from UCLA and UCSF that they will not be able to host the RDAEF examinations scheduled for August 2020, due to COVID-19 concerns.

Under the Governor's Declaration of Emergency regarding COVID-19 (Executive Order N-39-20), the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs is authorized to waive laws and regulations pertaining to professional licensing requirements during this state of emergency. In accordance with the Executive Order, on August 21, 2020, the Board submitted a waiver to the Director requesting temporary suspension of the requirement for RDAEF applicants to successfully pass the clinical and practical examination for licensure due to the inability of the Board to secure examination testing locations to host the clinical and practical examination because of COVID-19 related concerns. On August 31, 2020 the Board received notice that the waiver was denied. Furthermore, the Department has not waived any clinical or practical examinations for any other licensing board at this time.

Since the waiver has been denied, Board staff continues to reach out to dental schools in addition to UCLA and UCSF, in both northern and southern California. Thus far staff have been unsuccessful in being able to reserve a host school for at least the first part of 2021 for various reasons, including, local shelter-in-place orders, other COVID-19 restrictions, COVID-19 screening and/or testing requirements at the school, and inadequate facilities.

The Board has already established by working with OPES that due to ethical and practical considerations, dental licensure examinations are moving away from patient-based assessments and this trend has been accelerated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The has Board acknowledged the challenges with the administration of the RDAEF clinical and practical examinations, the fact that RDAEFs are a supervised profession requiring supervising dentists to determine when a RDAEF is ready to practice and perform the duties of their licensure, the fact the Board has not received consumer complaints relating to RDAEFs performing these tested procedures, and the fact the Board has already suspended and then eliminated the Registered Dental Assistant (RDA) practical examination for similar issues.

At its December 2020 meeting, the Board directed staff to submit a legislative proposal and seek an author to repeal the clinical and practical examination requirements for Registered Dental Assistant in Extended Functions (RDAEF) licensure. Board staff submitted the legislative proposal to the Senate Business, Profession, and Economic Development (BP&ED) Committee in early January. Additionally, Board staff have had discussions with Senate BP&ED Committee consultants and Senate Republican Caucus consultants to present the proposal and address questions. The Senate BP&ED Committee consultants are assisting Board staff with identifying an authors and appropriate legislative vehicles for this proposal.
